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Message from School Administration

First Term Report Cards

Reports cards for the first term of the school year (Sept.-Jan.) will be going home on Wednesday, February 22nd. Whereas the progress reports that went home in November provided descriptive feedback on how your child had been progressing at that time, these reports will also include letter grades for the Grade 1 to 6 classes and numerical grades for the Intermediate classes. Kindergarten classes will continue to receive descriptive feedback on their progress.

Once you have received the report card, we encourage you to review this with your child. Conversations around achievement help to celebrate the successes of your child, as well as working to set goals for those areas where your child would like to improve their achievement. The tear-off sections of the report cards can be used as a format to do just that. Please be sure to return the tear-off section to the school.

Safe Arrival System

lust a reminder that our new Safe Arrival system is now in play. It allows you to report your child's absence quickly and conveniently, in **any one** of the following **three** ways:

By calling 1-866-740-2902 toll free; (no need to register in order to use this option)

By logging into the Parent Portal website at **kprdsb.schoolconnects.com** to set up the ability to report absences online (you must have an account for this option), or;

By downloading an app onto your iOS or Android device, to report absences.
(you must have an account for this option),

You are able to use whichever of these methods you prefer to report your child's absence, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. You are also able to report future absences at any time.

If you have changed your email address, please contact the school office to have your contact information updated.

Student Safety

Just a reminder to parents. At morning entrance and at dismissal at the end of the day, we would ask that parents please do not enter the school with your child/ren. Rather than escorting your child directly to the classroom, we ask that you accompany them to our school yard where they line up with the rest of their classmates to enter the building.

Should you need to speak to your child's teacher, we ask that you please use our main entrance at the front of the school and report to the office so that we can let the teacher know that you would like to meet with them.

While we certainly do welcome parents to John M. James, for the safety of your children, we must know who is visiting in our building at all times. We sincerely appreciate your understanding in these matters.

Signing In/Out Routines

Students are to remain on school property from the time they arrive at school to the time they leave at the end of the day.

Exceptions:

- Students who have returned a signed permission form allowing them to go home for lunch (2nd nutrition break) each day during this school year. (These were distributed on the first day of school.) Please note that these students still must sign out when they head out for lunch and sign in when they return from lunch.
- 2) Students who bring in a note from a parent/guardian stating they have permission to go home for lunch on a specific day or that they have an appointment that day. This note should be brought to the office at the beginning of the school day and the student should sign out. If/When the child returns to the school after lunch or an appointment, they must remember to sign back in at the office.

Students are <u>never to leave the school property without permission</u>. It is very important that the school knows where all of the students are at all times!!!
