Message from School Administration

The Importance of Punctuality

Lately (no pun intended), we have been getting an increasing number of students whom are arriving late for school in the morning. We need your help to ensure that your children are getting to school on time.

This may not seem like too big of a deal; however, arriving to school late in the morning often has the following impact:

- ⇒ Disruption of a student's routine, which can throw some students off for the rest of the day;
- ⇒ Disruption to classroom instruction that is already in progress;
- Congestion in the main office due to the secretaries needing to sign people in and write late slips;
- ■⇒ Establishment of habitual behaviour where students can get the impression that being late is the norm:
- ⇒ Creation of additional anxiety in students from feeling rushed and having to catch up from the get go.

Please help us in ensuring that your children have the best possible start to their day. Thank you.

Bullying - How Can We as Partners Respond and Advocate?

First, and foremost, it is important to ensure that we have fluid two-way communication between home and school. Most often, bullying behaviours occur and continue when the person who is doing the bullying thinks that no one is aware of what is going on. Observe your child's behaviour. If there are changes, watch and listen more actively - try to engage your child in conversation, and let school administrators know when your child discloses bullying situations.

Please continue to assist us in helping to underscore the difference between "Telling" and "Tattling". Telling is for the purpose of holding everyone accountable to the same standards of behaviour and letting the right people know so that something can be done. "Tattling" is to get somebody in trouble for the shear enjoyment of it. Fear of retribution is often what keeps children quiet and keeps the cycle going. We can act without naming a child. If we know when and where to watch, our job is much easier.

In addition to continuing to ensure that students are clear on the differences between bullying and conflict, we are also currently working with our students to get some input around the reporting of bullying. Our current data says that students are telling someone when this does happen. However, this information may not be making its way to the adults in the building who can help.

Bullying is a part of every facet of our society—children live with these poor examples every day. We need to make sure we provide examples of character - integrity and the courage to stand up for what is right.

Power is in the hands of the person who demonstrates these characteristics. Power is only relinquished when people succumb to the person who is demonstrating bullying behaviours, compromise their standards and ultimately, their self-esteem.

Signing In/Out Routines

Students are to remain on school property from the time they arrive at school to the time they leave at the end of the day.

Exceptions:

- Students who have returned a signed permission form allowing them to go home for lunch (2nd nutrition break) each day during this school year. (These were distributed on the first day of school.) Please note that these students still must sign out when they head out for lunch and sign in when they return from lunch.
- 2) Students who bring in a note from a parent/guardian stating they have permission to go home for lunch on a specific day or that they have an appointment that day. This note should be brought to the office at the beginning of the school day and the student should sign out. If/When the child returns to the school after lunch or an appointment, they must remember to sign back in at the office.

Students are <u>never to leave the school property without permission</u>. It is very important that the school knows where all of the students are at all times!!!

Safe Arrival System

Just a reminder that our new Safe Arrival system is now in play. It allows you to report your child's absence quickly and conveniently, in any one of the following three ways:

- By calling 1-866-740-2902 toll free; (no need to register in order to use this option)
- By logging into the Parent Portal website at kprdsb.schoolconnects.com to set up the ability to report absences online (you must have an account for this option), or;
- By downloading an app onto your iOS or Android device, to report absences. (you must have an account for this option),

You are able to use whichever of these methods you prefer to report your child's absence, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. You are also able to report future absences at any time.

Visitor's Policy

All visitors, **including parents/guardians** are required to report to the Main Office upon arrival at the school and sign in. If you are staying for any length of time you will require a Visitor or Volunteer Pass. For your child's safety, it is important that we know the identity, at all times, of all the adults that are in our school.

If you are dropping off your child's lunch, forgotten homework, etc. please leave them at the office.

The secretary will ensure that necessary items are given to students in a timely manner, with minimal disruption to program.

Police Record Checks

(including Vulnerable Sector Screening & Search of Sexual Offences Database)

It is wonderful to have so many parents/ quardians wanting to volunteer in our school each day! We greatly appreciate all of your help!! Board Policy does require that all school volunteers (e.g. trip chaperones, parent drivers, hot lunch helpers, classroom helpers, pediculosis volunteers, etc.) receive a Criminal Records Check and Vulnerable Sector Screening. These must be completed every year. These can be completed locally at the Bowmanville or Oshawa office of the Durham Regional Police Services. A letter from the school is required to begin the process. This letter can be picked up at the school office. There is a fee for this service (the records check, not the letter). If you have already completed a record check from the police department, please submit it to the school as soon as possible as we need to have this information on file. For those that are still waiting to receive their information from the police department, please bring it in to the school as soon as possible. Again, please note that all volunteer applicants must provide the school or volunteer program contact with a police record check that:

- is dated within one year
- identifies any criminal convictions or criminal charges
- includes a search of the Pardoned Sexual

Offences Database, and

- includes a Vulnerable Sector Search

8:30 - 8:45


12:45 -12:55
